Resolution of Members Regarding Amendment of Certificate of Incorporation

The voting members (the "Members") of the American Association of Physics Teachers, Incorporated ("AAPT"), at a meeting held on January ___, 2015, adopted the following resolution by a majority vote of the Members present, the affirmative votes cast in favor thereof being at least equal to a quorum:

WHEREAS, AAPT was formed under the New York Membership Corporations Law on February 3, 1958 and is subject to the provisions of the New York Not-for-Profit Corporation Law ("NPCL"); and

WHEREAS, the NPCL requires the unanimous consent of members to approve an action taken without a meeting, unless a provision of the certificate of incorporation, not inconsistent with the NPCL, allows for the written consent of less than all of the members; and

WHEREAS, the Members desire to add a provision to the certificate of incorporation of AAPT to allow Members to approve an action taken without a meeting by written consent of less than all of the Members; and

WHEREAS, the NPCL requires the amendments to the certificate of incorporation include the post office address of the office without the state at which the books and records of the corporation shall be kept and the designation of the Secretary of State as agent for service of process; and

WHEREAS, the NPCL requires that amendments to the certificate of incorporation be authorized by a majority vote of the Members at a meeting, the affirmative votes cast in favor of the amendment being at least equal to a quorum; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the bylaws of AAPT, Members entitled to cast 100 votes or one-tenth of the total number of votes entitled to be cast thereat, whichever is less, present in person or by proxy, shall constitute a quorum at a meeting of Members for the transaction of any business;
