(3) Would all the paper ever manufactured suffice to cover the land areas of the Earth?

The area in question is  $2 \times 10^{14}$  m<sup>2</sup>. We can forget about everything but newsprint. One square meter of paper, printed on both sides, makes ten newspaper pages of New York Times size. Have  $2 \times 10^{15}$  newspaper pages been printed? I estimate that the daily circulation in the U.S. and Canada is not more than  $10^8$  newspapers of 20 pages. The total world daily circulation surely does not exceed three times that, which is  $6 \times 10^9$  pages per day, or  $2 \times 10^{12}$  pages per year. Paper has been manufactured at the current rate for much less than 1000 years. The answer is no.
